LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Veterinary Dermatology continues to be an active, exciting and dynamic field. The level of knowledge is rising steadily as more and more national and international post-graduate courses are organised. The increasing numbers of experienced dermatologists are accelerating the accumulation of knowledge and providing a greatly improved service in many areas. The demand for more sophisticated further education is rising. ESVD continues to play a significant part in this process of development by providing courses and meetings, by publication of the journal, Veterinary Dermatology, and by liaison with other European and World specialist organisations.

At present, ESVD is holding discussions with the European Community Advisory Committee for Veterinary Training, in conjunction with other specialist societies, with a view to setting up a system to allow for trans-national recognition of specialists. Considerable progress has already been made but much remains to be done and it is not yet possible to predict the kind of structure which will emerge from this process. However, it is clear that all of the specialists are keen to ensure that, as far as possible, uniformly high standards will be established throughout Europe, including countries outside the EC. A liaison committee of specialist societies has been set up to co-ordinate the views of the specialists. Reports of progress in this area will be published in the Bulletin in due course.

Within ESVD an important process of development and maturation is also in progress. We now have about 330 members and our annual meetings attract well over that number. It will be increasingly important to ensure that we maintain good communication with each other as our numbers rise.

This will be facilitated by the regular production of the Bulletin and I hope that you will not hesitate to submit material to the Editor, Ian Mason. Publication of ideas allows them to be discussed and considered by a wide variety of members in a way which is not possible during our busy annual meetings.

We are also aiming to make the Annual Report more informative. This year we have a much more detailed report of proceedings at the Annual Meeting and the Treasurers Report is also included. All members should by now have received a copy of the ESVD Constitution and will have read of discussions about the possible need to amend this (a topic which is under active consideration by the Board) in Volume 3, No. 1 of the Bulletin. The views of all members are solicited on this and I hope that you will not hesitate to contact Board Members with any ideas which you wish to put forward. Any possible changes will be considered at the Luxembourg meeting in July. This will be held in the European Hemicycle, and promises to be an excellent meeting. Details are given elsewhere in this report.

Another exciting meeting now being prepared will take place in Montreal, Canada in May, 1992. This will be the 2nd World Congress of Veterinary Dermatology and promises to be bigger and at least as enjoyable as the last. I hope that many European dermatologists will plan to attend. Our Annual Meeting in 1992 will be in Rome, in conjunction with the WSAVA. It will be intentionally a more modest meeting so as to avoid competing with the Montreal Congress but we can be certain that the warmth of Italian hospitality will not be at all limited.

REPORT OF THE 7TH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ESVD, STOCKHOLM, 7TH - 9TH SEPTEMBER 1990

Looking at the headline one cannot help being impressed. 7th Annual Meeting — that's something. What a line of evolution we have been watching — from a little group of people gathered at WSAVA in Hamburg to big solitary congresses as have happened in the past years.

Stockholm! — For a Scandinavian it was nice that the ESVD at last tried to move away from Central Europe. Refreshing. The congress was beautifully situated in the archipelago of Stockholm, one of the most magnificent nature resorts one can think of. The conference centre had so many options for outdoor activities (bicycles, canoeing, rowboats, windsurfing, walking paths and more) that one easily could forget the congress had it not been for the efforts of the organising committee. Ewa, Helene and Ulla — You did so well.

The congress was attended by nearly 200 participants from 16 countries and offered several excellent speakers in many different subjects ranging from paleodermatology (Danny Scott's favourite in topical treatment) to new aspects of hyperadrenocorticism covered brilliantly by Stephen D. White. I've never seen as many cushingoid dogs as after being enlightened

in Stockholm. Subjects covered were nail disorders, seborrhea, feline eosinophilic granuloma complex, dermatoses induced by physical factors, EFAs, cutaneous drug eruptions — just to mention a few. Richard Halliwell, Ken Mason, David Lloyd, Didier Carlotti and many more, it will not be possible within this limited space to mention and pay tribute to all the fine lecturers we laid ears to. Sorry. Running parallel with the small animal programme was a large animal section. Sunday I had to leave before the congress was finished since we had a ferry to catch in Goteborg.

The social programme was fine with the contest featuring «panworld» dermatologists singing songs from home as the highlight. The Jury had a tough time but very justly chose Greece as the winner — absolutely a worthy and popular finalist.

Yet another good event — may many like this follow in the years to come.

THE ESVD IN 1990 : VIEWS FROM A DELEGATE

The Board has invited me to summarise my impressions of our organisation during this past year. I would like to discuss some of the strong and weak points of the ESVD during 1990 and my hopes for the future.

Overall, 1990 was a good year for the ESVD. In spite of occasional political problems, the board was exceptionally dedicated, and the board members must be thanked for all of their hard work and long hours during the past months. The ESVD bulletin and annual report were professional, and they served the purpose of keeping the members informed on the activities of the organisation.

I was unable to attend the Jersey course of dermatology of reptiles and birds but I understand that it was interesting and enjoyable. Despite complaints regarding the lack of microscopes, and poor delegate attendance, this course was a brave beginning in an area where relatively little is known. Perhaps, if veterinarians can be stimulated to take an interest in the dermatology of non-domestic species, the attendance at future meetings will improve.

The ESVD Annual Meeting in Stockholm was a meeting to remember. In spite of the expense, the repetition of topics already presented many times before, the scarcity of free communications and new information, the undemocratic election procedure, and the bad and cold weather, the meeting was definitely worth attending. The organisation was excellent.

The scientific programme was varied and included much equine dermatology. There were talks by several well-known dermatologists from around the world. This meeting was the birthplace of a new ESVD dermatopathology study-group. The annual business meeting served as a place for sounding new ideas and complaints. The meeting location was good, the housing and food were adequate, and the social atmosphere was friendly and entertaining. Special thanks should be given to the Swedish organisers for making this meeting worth attending.

I was unable to attend the dermatology oncology workshop in Barcelona because it was held just after the meeting in Sweden, but I understand that it was also quite successful. The programme was interesting and the material presented was at a high scientific level. In the future, I hope that the ESVD educational events will be separated so that veterinarians can spread-out the time and money spent at meetings.

In conclusion, the future of the ESVD seems encouraging and I am looking forward to 1991. The board seems to have listened to complaints from the membership, and exciting constructive changes are already taking place. We should soon see the rebirth of a more scientific, more democratic, and more accessible organisation.

Comments on the Provisional Budget

The Stockholm Congress was largely profit-making, which was unexpected, considering the cost of living in Sweden and the distance. We owe this result to the great efficiency of the local organisation committee, which succeeded in finding a considerable sponsorship particularly in their own country.

The lesson must be learnt that the outcome from a congress is always uncertain in both directions. Our society has complete autonomy of management, and a failure for whatever reason (wave of terrorism, transport strike) would have dramatic results : therefore this unhelped-for profit will serve as insurance for the future.

The courses are, in spite of the limited number of participants, very costly to organise ; therefore, all we are seeking is their financial equilibrium.

The number of membership fees and subscriptions to Veterinary Dermatology has been estimated purposely with caution. This year the European Association for Veterinary Specialisation can offer considerable support to the ESVD thanks to European Commission funds.

In terms of expenditure, we foresee three Board meetings in 1991 and the purchase of a fax machine which will be loaned from one year to the next to the organisers of the Annual Congresses.

The Board has fixed the 1991 Annual Membership fee at 50 XEU and the subscription to Veterinary Dermatology at 30 XEU.

NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL ORGANISATIONS

BELGIUM

The Belgian group of veterinary dermatology (Groupe de travail en dermatologie vétérinaire) was created on the 22nd June 1985 on the initiative of Doctor E. Fauvel.

Like other Belgian study groups it is an integral part of SAVAB (Small Animal Veterinary Association of Belgium).

For five years this group of thirty veterinary surgeons has met five times a year. Those concerned organised, alternately, a small meeting reserved for its members, and a larger meeting open to the whole profession.

The small meetings focused on a discussion of clinical cases to a chosen theme. Everyone was able to benefit from the successes and the failures of the others who had experienced rare or difficult cases.

The larger meetings take the form of conferences with a much wider audience : (one day's conference of SAVAB, post graduate seminars in the Brabant region, conferences organised by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, and one-day meetings put on by pharmaceutical firms).

Since 1989 our group has organised a national scientific day at the end of each year.

Because of the small size of our country, we would like the maximum contact with groups of foreign dermatologists and especially with members of GEDAC (French group).

To achieve this aim this year, we are organising the 8th congress of the ESVD in Luxembourg.

This spring the first edition of the « Cahiers Belges de Dermatologie » will appear. This journal which will be published twice a year will allow members of the profession to benefit from its scientific news.

GERMANY

The Veterinär-dermatologisches Arbeitskreis is a group of 200-300 veterinarians from Germany, Switzerland, France, Belgium, Austria, Italy and Luxembourg who have a great interest in veterinary dermatology. Two meetings were held in Bad Kreuznach with the following programmes.

24th-25th February : The speakers were Dr. C. Marshall, Dr. L. Ferrer, Dr. D. Carlotti, Dr. D. Lloyd, and Dr. T. Willimsoe. The topics were cytology in practice, clinical diagnostic procedures, differential diagnosis of pruritic skin diseases, feline allergic skin disease, Leishmaniasis and bacterial skin infections.

5th-6th May : Drs. Craig Griffin and Mark Peterson from the USA and Dr. C. von Tscharner from Switzerland spoke about hormonal skin disease. This was a repeat of the seminar given in November 1989 because of the great interest and demand for space.

FRANCE

In 1990, the GEDAC organised :

A two day meeting « 6^e journées du GEDAC » in June, devoted to small animal dermatology and to comparative dermatology. The meeting was held in Bordeaux. Two programmes — comprehensive and advanced — were held.

Comprehensive :

- The dermatologic examination
- Practical aids to diagnosis
- Autoimmune dermatoses
- Genodermatoses
- Feline dermatosis

Advanced :

- The skin and immunodeficiency
- Drug eruptions
- Pediatric dermatology

This very nice meeting was attended by 150 delegates.

The post congress day (CNVSPA meeting Paris), on the 1st December, was also a success with 122 delegates attending. There were two themes :

- Morning : Nodular dermatoses of man, dog, cat and horse.
- Afternoon : The diagnostic approach and therapy of pruritus in the dog and cat.

ITALY

1. AIDeV (Associazione Italiana di Dermatologia Veterinaria) organised two meetings in 1990 :

1st May 1990 — Bologna, Italy.

The theme was « Pigmentary disturbances » and the speaker was Eric Guaguère (F). Some clinical cases also were presented by the members.

7th-9th December 1990 — University of Pisa.

The programme of the meeting was as follows :

- a. Pododermatitis (anatomy, histology and clinical features) — N. Gasparinetti, S. Taraglio, A. Vercelli, G. Raviri, C. Ciriani, R. Morganti (I).
- b. State of the art of round cell tumours — L. Poli (I).
- c. Dr. D. Lloyd (UK) gave four papers on : Infection, immunity and inflammation of the skin ; Use and misuse of anti-inflammatory drugs ; Use of EFA in dermatology ; The importance of cytology in dermatology.

The programme for 1991 will include a seminar during the national congress of AIVPA in September. Blaise Hubert (Beriers - France), will speak on physiology and biochemistry of the sex hormones, and the clinical manifestations of sex hormone related dermatoses.

The speakers were Dr. R. Halliwell and Dr. D. W. Angarano. As a representative of SCIVAC Dermatology Group, A. Fondati reported on the most common allergens causing atopy in dogs in Italy.

Besides the instructive and superb lessons in both small and large animal dermatology, and the fun of meeting friends from all over the world, there was a nice warm and slightly unconventional feeling during the whole meeting, just enough to give

everyone a memorable time. When have you ever been to a conference where every speaker is introduced by specially written poems and thanked with a beautiful hand-crafted gift ? The congress dinner became a fantastic party, with every guest wildly participating in a big « European Song Contest » where the different countries had one marvellous solo-artist, as the winning Greece, or a whole choir of unprepared, more or less brilliant singers. It was an absolutely unbelievable experience !

The Swedish Dermatology Study Group also had a meeting in February 1990 arranged by Birgit Holm and a report on this has already been given by Helene Raue in the last Annual Report. These short conferences are excellent for participants to talk about their own dermatology problem cases ; whether small and ordinary or big and more sophisticated, it doesn't matter. We would like everyone to show slides and histopathology is also most welcome. This is good training for all of us and as a consequence we now have lots of practitioners in Sweden who have a special interest in dermatology and are able to talk the « dermlanguage ». That's nice !

In May 1991 the Group will arrange a bigger meeting with one day of ordinary discussions and case-reports and for the other days speakers will be invited from US (Peter Ihrke and Thelma Lee Gross). But more about that in the next issue of ESVD Annual Report.

UNITED KINGDOM

The British Veterinary Dermatology Study Group held two meetings during 1990.

The annual pre-BSAVA meeting was held in Harrogate on the 19th April. Papers were presented on « Idiopathic seborrhoea in cocker spaniels » and « Topical therapeutics » by Ken Kwochka, « The role of the veterinary dermatohistopathologist » by Trevor Whitbread, « Ectoparasites of laboratory animals » by Dawn Owen and « The immune response to ectoparasites » by Professor Lord Soulsby.

A meeting was held in Glasgow on the 9th November 1990 on the theme of « Comparative aspects of infectious skin disease ». Papers were presented on « Factors influencing immunity to dermatophytosis » by Anna Sanders, « Ultrastructural aspects of the pathogenesis of dermatophytosis » by Nick Ambrose, « Pityrosporum in canine skin biopsies » by Pauline McNeil, « Pityrosporum : many theories, few proofs » by Malcolm Richardson, « Canine staphylococcal pyoderma » by Neil McEwan, « Staphylococcus epidermidis — commensal or pathogen » by Angella Farrell and « Colonization and infection of the skin by Gram negative bacilli » by Bill Noble.

The Dermatology Unit at the Royal Veterinary College held a Symposium on Otitis Externa with papers on « Allergic and immune-mediated disease » by Ton Willemse, « Parasitic infestations » by David Grant, « Bacterial and fungal disease » by Didier Carlotti and « Conformation and the surgical approach » by Chris Little.

DERMATOPATHOLOGY GROUP OF THE ESVD

The Dermatopathology of the ESVD was definitively created in 1990. The group was constituted by 25 persons from 11 different countries. The main objectives of the group are to promote the advance of veterinary dermatopathology in Europe and to establish relationships between different people and research groups working in pathology of the skin.

During the 7th Congress of the ESVD held in Stockholm the first meeting of the group took place. Different members of the group presented clinicopathologic cases for discussion including :

- Hepatocutaneous syndrome in a dog (A. Koutinas, Greece)
- Comparative pathology of lichenoid tissue reactions (P. McNeil, Scotland).

- A case of feline SLE (M. van Niel, The Netherlands).
- Bowen's disease in three cats (V. Affolter, Switzerland).
- Immunocytochemical study of canine lymphoma (L. Ferrer, Spain).

During the meeting, the members of the group decided to begin a continuing education programme in 1991. Members of the group will circulate interesting cases to the other members. Luis Ferrer will coordinate this programme. The next meeting of the group will be in Luxembourg, the day before the Congress of the ESVD (5th July).

ESVD ANNUAL MEETING 1991 Luxemburg, 6TH-7TH JULY 1991

On the 6th/7th July 1991 the 8th Annual Congress of the ESVD will be held in the rooms of the European Parliament in Luxembourg.

The programme consists of a very interesting combination of a scientific programme and a clinical programme with speakers coming from every part of Europe and also from the U.S.A. ESVD members from all European countries have sent their recommendations for the programme, and the scientific committee did their very best to choose the most promising themes for this meeting. Not only will new therapeutic concepts and newly recognised diseases be presented, but also « state-of-the-art » lectures on modern concepts of inflammation together with a two day clinical programme on feline skin diseases. Equally the presence of G.H. Muller, R.W. Kirk and D.W. Scott, the three authors of « Small Animal Dermatology », together for the first time in Europe, sounds very attractive. While all presentations will be given in English, the clinical programme will be translated simultaneously into German and French. Between 400 to 600 participants (mostly practitioners) from all over Europe and possibly from the USA may be expected.

Not only is the scientific programme exciting, but Luxembourg itself (both town and country) is worth visiting. The « Green Heart of Europe » is an ideal location in the centre of Europe between Belgium, Germany and France, and is easily accessible from all directions ; by bus, train, plane and car. The landscape is a very charming mixture of contrasts. North of the River Sauer, the Luxembourgian part of the Ardennes Hills (« Osling » or Islek) is located with numerous castles mostly built in the Middle Ages, and picturesque deep river valleys and extensive forests. Some of the most important towns are Clervaux (beautiful 800 year-old castle, Benedictine Abbey), Wiltz (old castle, Witches' Tower) and Vianden (« most beautiful

castle on the left side of the Rhine », the house of Victor Hugo and the fjord-like storage-lake of the River Our which has one of the biggest pumping works world-wide). In the middle of the country an area called « Luxembourgian Switzerland » is located around Echternach. It is said to be Luxembourg's most beautiful part. The old cathedral with the grave of St. Willibrord who came from England and was the founder of the town, and the St. Peter and Paul Church and the Market Place are all very impressive.

The dermatosis is characterised by annular areas of alopecia which are erythematous, scaly, more or less symmetrical, and localised to the face and neck. The disorder is worse in summer and there is no systemic involvement.

Histologically, a lichenoid and hydropic interface dermatitis is seen. Direct immunofluorescence testing reveals the deposition of immunoglobulin G at the dermoepidermal junction. The dermatosis is well controlled with oral corticosteroids and photoprotection. Comparative aspects with DLE in man and dog are presented.

Scott D.W. – Dermal histopathology of hypersensitivity to culicoides fly bites in horses. *Point Vet.* 1990, 22, 131, 583-588. Culicoides hypersensitivity is the most common allergic skin disease in the horse. A retrospective histopathologic study was performed on the skin biopsies from 21 horses with this dermatosis. The typical histologic appearance is that of a perivascular dermatitis, most commonly superficial and deep, and most often hyperplastic. A second, more focal inflammatory pattern was present, including eosinophilic granulomatous dermatitis or intraepidermal pustular (neutrophilic) dermatitis.

Scott D.W., Gourreau, J.M. – Alopecia areata in cattle. *Point Vet.* 1990, 22, 132, 671-674. Alopecia areata is rarely reported in cattle. It is an idiopathic disease in which immunologic mechanisms are thought to play a role. The dermatosis is characterised by one or several annular areas of alopecia, especially on the face, head or neck. Skin in the areas of alopecia appears normal. The lesions are neither pruritic nor painful, and affected cattle are otherwise healthy. Skin biopsy is diagnostic, revealing a lymphocytic peribulbar perifolliculitis. Animals with localised lesions may undergo spontaneous remission after a few months. Animals with more generalised lesions may never improve. There is presently no effective treatment.
